Background

- Representing 44 towns within the boundaries of the Bennington Regional Commission and the Windham Regional Commission.
- Adopted the last Comprehensive Economic Development Strategy (CEDS) in 2019; four updates to this document.
- Vision Statement:
 - In 2030, the Southern Vermont Economic Development Zone will be home to a resilient, creative, and inclusive community in which businesses and people thrive and prosper.

CEDS Addresses

- 1. Increase the Population: Attract more people to live in SoVT; to participate in the community; the workforce; and support the business and civic environment.
- 2. Improve the Physical Infrastructure: Make critical infrastructure improvements so that SoVT is resident and business ready.
- **3. Enhance the Social Infrastructure**: Improve quality of life and stability for residents.
- **4. Expand the Business Infrastructure**: Create an environment encouraging more jobs and opportunities.
- 5. Develop the Economic Development Capacity: Enhance the ability of economic development professionals and partners to participate in implementation.



Why Develop a CEDS?

- To help lead the locally-based, regionally driven economic development planning process that leverages the involvement of the public, private, and non-profit sectors to establish a strategic blueprint for regional collaboration.
- The strategic blueprint, the *CEDS*, is a strategy-driven plan for regional economic development.
- It provides a coordinating mechanism for individuals, organizations, local governments, and private industry to engage in meaningful conversations and debates about the economic direction of the SoVT Zone.

CEDS Details

- A CEDS must contain:
 - Summary Background: A summary background of the economic conditions of the Zone;
 - SWOT Analysis;
 - Strategic Direction/Action Plan;
 - Evaluation Framework;
 - Resiliency Study and Strategy.





CEDS Details, con't

- The CEDS should incorporate, and be incorporated, into other local and regional planning efforts.
- The CEDS should be implemented by economic development agencies who own elements of the plan.
- The *CEDS* opens U.S. EDA funding to the Zone.
- The CEDS is a five-year plan.



Resiliency in the CEDS

- Identify persistent economic challenges or deficiencies
- Prepare for disruptions by identifying "early-warning" tools
- Build mechanisms that create flexibility
- Promote a positive vision for the Zone

Will incorporate outreach, research, and a Resiliency Plan into the *CEDS* document.





Examples of Available Funding

- Planning and Local Technical Assistance programs: U.S. EDA assists eligible recipients in developing economic development plans and studies designed to build capacity, and guide an area's or region's economic prosperity and resiliency.
- Provide investments that support construction, non-construction, planning, technical assistance, and revolving loan fund projects under EDA's Public works program and Economic Adjustment Assistance program (which includessovermont Assistance to Coal Communities, Nuclear Closure Communities, and Biomass Closure Communities).

CEDS Success

- Approximately 400 EDA-recognized Economic Development Districts (EDDs)
 - SoVT Zone has applied to be one
- CEDS is a required document of an EDD, and to receive most U.S. EDA funding
- For many years, CEDS were "part of the motion" to apply for and receive federal funding
- Was a constant complaint that CEDS were irrelevant
- The U.S. EDA has worked hard to make the CEDS more accessible, relevant, and easier to produce



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However,

- In all A/R360's work across the country, including doing *CEDS* in our own Regions and organizations, YOUR *CEDS* and process is *outstanding*.
- It is a living document, cared for, prepared with thoughtfulness, and used to create a forum and drive regional economic development.
